# Kessel Run's C2IMERA featured at Red Flag

Red Flag-Nellis 23-1 integrated a Kessel Run application into its operations for the first time this past January.

Close to 100 aircraft and 3,000 coalition service members participated in this large force air combat training exercise centered on readiness and interoperability between joint and allied forces. This iteration focused on the Indo-Pacific theater and the pacing challenge, alongside allied partners.

Red Flag is a multinational exercise held at Nellis Air Force Base, Nev., three times a year, meant to test and prepare service members and coalition partners' capabilities through various real-world scenarios.

Exercise planners used Kessel Run's C2IMERA, or Command and Control Incident Management Emergency Response Application. Its software focuses on reporting, planning, force generation, emergency management, and command and control monitoring and execution.

"Aligning the development of agile combat employ-

ment concepts with this critical capability has been a priority of the 505th since Air Combat Command directed the fielding of C2IMERA at all installations in August 2021," said Col. Adam Shelton, 505th Test and Training Group commander, Hurlburt Field, Fla. "Merging new employment concepts, maturing technology, and redesigned wing organizational structures is a complex task. However, the teamwork between the 705th Training Squadron cadre and Kessel Run professionals enabled the integration of C2IMERA into Red Flag 23-1 for the first time. This development will continue to improve future Red Flag training for wing command and control force elements and will set the stage to better prepare and certify wings prior to their commit phase of the Air Force Force Generation model."

The application uses a common operating picture and dashboarding capabilities as communication tools, which consolidates and shares information for leaders, and boasts a plethora of features to provide C2 capabilities. These tools are customizable and optimized based on the individual needs of the installation and also focus on updating and communicating data in real time to give commanders a constant picture of their installations, environment, assets and personnel.

C2IMERA was employed throughout the training to give exercise participants in multiple locations a continuous picture, in real time, of assets, personnel, mishaps, aircraft, and munitions according to Master Sgt. Kirsten Sigerson, 355th Wing Command Post superintendent.

Multiple scenarios included downed aircraft, mishaps and personnel recovery. Sigerson said she was able to leverage C2IMERA to track information and report it to leadership in real time.

"C2IMERA is a system where we have a common installation picture," said Sigerson. "You have a full picture of what is happening real time at the location viewing such as road closures, threats to buildings, or any kind of medical responses. Anyone with an account can see what's happening in real time."

Kessel Run is a Division within Air Force Life Cycle Management Center's Digital Directorate. Kessel Run is an Agile Software Development unit building a scalable software factory to architect, manufacture and operate wing and operational-level C2 systems.



## Trust connects people to each other and mission

Having trust in an organization is one of the most foundational principles that can help people feel connected to each other and the mission.

Trust plays an enormous part in positively shaping the organization's culture. According to a Harvard Business Review study, high-trust organizations experience less stress, have more energy, are more productive, experience fewer absences, cultivate engaged subordinates, and lead people to be more satisfied with their lives in general.

So, how do you cultivate trust? Leaders build trust through applying transparency, authenticity, credibility, and reliability.

Transparency is essential to communicating the organization's goals and intentions. It forces leaders to be open and candid with their subordinates and ensures employees are armed with as many resources as possible.

This is key to leveraging the very best in people and processes. Leaders should offer regular and candid feedback that seeks to refine skills and set standards while being constructive and informative. However, leaders should be attentive and willing to accept feedback in return. Seeking feedback on how to better train, equip, and organize their force forms long lasting, high performing teams.

Authenticity starts with being aware of yourself. Knowing your own values is essential to valuing and honing qualities in others and the organization. This principle can be cultivated by developing a high level of emotional intelligence. A foundational aspect of authenticity is having a true desire to know and help your subordinates do well leading to organizational and personal successes. Another important aspect of this is showing vulnerability by owning your mistakes, admitting when you are wrong, and using lessons learned in the past to show your own humanity, especially when employees tend to put leaders on pedestals.

Reliability and credibility mean that you are consistent and follow-through with your commitments. Your actions align with your values and those of your organization and naturally forges paths to success. It also means making well-informed, timely decisions. When leaders change positions or even their core values, it confuses subordinates and causes the organization to lose its identity. Paralysis by analysis is a real threat to reliability and credibility alike. Leaders are not expected to know everything. When they are not the experts, they should appoint and rely on those who are to make decisions. Additionally, leaders must demonstrate integrity and fairness, especially when it comes to offering opportunities to lead teams and advance within the organization. A final component of reliability is accountability in yourself and your subordinates against well-defined standards.

Trust is a highly dynamic principle, often subjective to our personal biases and perspectives. It is difficult to gain and even more difficult to regain after it is lost. However, applying these principles can go a long way in building an organization that cultivates trust at its core allowing employees to be truly connected to each other and the mission.

# RAF Voyager fuels the fight at Red Flag 23-1

The Royal Air Force's Voyager aircraft took part in Red Flag-Nellis 23-1, Jan. 23-Feb. 10, 2023.

Red Flag is a major coalition military exercise that takes place at Nellis Air Force Base and on the Nevada Test and Training Range.

The Voyager plays a crucial role in meeting the pacing challenge and supports the United States and allied air forces to overcome the tyranny of dis-

tance. Throughout the three-week long exercise, it will fly twice a day refueling U.S. Marine Corps F-35B Lightning IIs, RAF FGR4 Typhoons and Royal Australian Air Force EA-18G Growlers.

"Red Flag provides the highest possible level of planning and training with our coalition partners," said RAF Air Commodore Howard Edwards, Combat Air commander. "Here we are exposed to tactics, techniques and procedures that could be used against a peer adversary, and we can practice using a full spectrum of capabilities, some of which can only be practiced over the NTTR."

The exercise provides a realistic training environment for the Voyager's

aircrew, allowing them to practice and improve their skills in a simulated combat environment while maintaining their mission of providing aerial

refueling for participating aircraft. "As a key enabler for jets, exercises like this allow us to practice how we can effectively get to them, to the fight and back again also maximizing their training benefit," said Edwards.

The Voyager's capabilities give military commanders greater flexibility that allows them to respond to a broader range of scenarios. Its ability to provide aerial refueling and transportation support allows other aircraft to operate at a higher tempo and stay in the air for extended periods.

"Modern warfighting occurs across a range of environments and is almost always done in coalitions with our partners and allies," said Sqdn. Ldr. Helen Train, the RAF Voyager detachment commander. "Exercises like this allow us to meet these allies face to face and learn how we can best integrate and enable their operations."

The Voyager has proven it is a true coalition force multiplier during this iteration of Red Flag.

"The Royal Air Force Voyager's versatility and capabilities make it a valuable asset to the coalition force and its ability to provide aerial refueling and transportation support is essential to the success of the future fight," said Col. Jared Hutchinson, 414th Combat Training Squadron commander. "Its participation in Red Flag 23-1 highlights its importance in supporting the United States and other allied nations in military operations."

# DAF issues guidance on COVID-related adverse actions; Religious Accommodation Requests

The Department of the Air Force has issued guidance on removal of adverse actions and handling of Religious Accommodation Requests related to refusal of COVID-19 vaccinations effective Feb. 24, 2023.

The DAF will remove adverse information from records of those currently serving service members who sought an exemption on religious, administrative, or medical grounds and who received adverse actions solely due to their refusal to take the vaccine. Members will be notified by their command or the Air Force Personnel Center/Air Reserve Personnel Center.

Current service members do not need to initiate any actions for their records to be updated.

Adverse information actions include:

• Letters of admonishment, counseling or reprimand, and records of individual counseling will be rescinded.

• Nonjudicial punishments issued solely for vaccine refusal will be set aside in their entirety.

• Referral performance reports issued solely for vaccine refusal after requesting an exemption will be removed from personnel records and replaced with a statement of non-rated time.

• Promotion records will be corrected by the DAF who will remove or redact all adverse actions related to vaccine refusal.

proceedings will be terminated.

Additionally, the department has cancelled all outstanding Religious Accommodation Requests for CO-VID-19 vaccination exemption. Members who submitted an RAR for non-COVID-19 vaccination exemptions may update and resubmit their request for other mandated vaccination exemptions. To expedite processing, members are asked to resubmit within 30 days.

The DAF has until March 17 to update records and notify affected members.

# DOD warns service members to avoid eating poppy seeds

Service members may want to hold off ordering that "everything" bagel.

It's not an urban legend: Eating poppy seeds can cause diners to test positive for codeine on a urinalysis, Defense Department officials said in a memo released Feb. 21, 2023.

"Recent data suggests certain poppy seeds varieties may have higher codeine contamination than previously reported," said Gilbert R. Cisneros Jr., the undersecretary of defense for personnel and readiness. "Consumption of poppy seed products could cause a codeine-positive urinalysis result and undermine the department's ability to identify illicit drug use."

This comes as something of a surprise for the department. At one point, some meals ready-to-eat contained lemon poppy seed cake, and dining facilities often served poppy seed salad dressing.

Officials became aware of the problem in 2022 and have worked to review the "limited scientific studies

and also contracted with an independent laboratory to have the codeine and morphine contamination of multiple poppy seed brands analyzed," officials said. "The analysis and other recently published studies were the catalyst for the warning regarding poppy seeds."

The poppy seed memo calls on the Army, Navy and

Air Force to notify service members "to avoid consumption of all poppy seeds, including food products and baked goods containing poppy seeds." Bagels, rolls, salads and salad dressing are the most common foods with poppy seeds, but there are many other foods where poppy seeds are used as spice. Many foods contain poppy seeds in the Balkans, the Middle East, and central and eastern Europe.

It's possible that some service members have been disciplined or discharged for "innocent or unknown ingestion" of poppy seeds, an official said. "We are currently working that analysis and focusing on codeineonly positive tests from fiscal year 2019 to present," the official continued. "This timeline is based on currently available information. The amount of poppy seeds consumed, concentration of codeine detected in urine and time of consumption relative to the drug test are also important factors. As we gather more information, we will reassess and update, as appropriate."

In his memo, Cisneros said service members should work with their local legal office for any related concerns with urinalysis results.
